What is the Scott Polar Research Institute?

The Institute was founded in 1920 as a memorial to Captain Robert Falcon Scott and his four companions who died on their return journey from the South Pole in 1912.

As part of the University of Cambridge, the Institute is home to exceptional polar heritage collections. Many of the stunning objects, photographs and archive materials are displayed in the Polar Museum, and visitors travel from all over the world to use the Institute's library, the World's premier polar information centre.

Treasures in the Polar Museum include many of Captain Scott's last letters, artefacts from the search for Sir John Franklin in the Arctic, and a very well-travelled telescope that has been both to Antarctica and into space. Over 50,000 visitors a year enjoy exhibitions and events at the Museum, which is open year round and free to visit.

The Institute's library is open to anyone who wants to use its outstanding collection of over 100,000 books, maps and pamphlets. The library, which incorporates the Shackleton Memorial Library, includes rare collections of material and is dedicated to making information globally available through the internet.







The Institute has several research groups investigating a range of globally important issues within the Arctic and Antarctic on both land and sea. Studies range from the links between glacier and ice-sheet shrinkage and global sea-level rise, to the impact of climate change on the reindeer herding peoples of the Siberian Arctic. We are also training the next generation of polar researchers.

The Institute's archive holds the world's largest and finest collection of polar material relating to British exploration in the Arctic and Antarctic regions. Treasures include Shackleton's Antarctic diaries.

Alongside the archive, the Picture library houses over 80,000 photographs including stunning images taken from the very early days of exploration.

Thanks to outstanding support, including that from the Friends, the Institute has been able to purchase over 100 negatives of Captain Scott's own photographs which had been believed lost


